

FACTS	WHAT DOES COREBRIDGE FINANCIAL (“COREBRIDGE”)* DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social Security number and Medical Information • Income and Credit History • Payment History and Employment Information <p>When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers’ personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers’ personal information; the reasons Corebridge chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who we are

Who is providing this notice? The Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company (VALIC), VALIC Financial Advisors, Inc. (VFA) and VALIC Retirement Services Company (VRSCO) (collectively, "Corebridge")*

What we do

How does Corebridge protect my personal information? To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include administrative, technical, and physical safeguards. We restrict access to employees, representatives, agents, or selected third parties who have been trained to handle nonpublic personal information.

How does Corebridge collect my personal information? We collect your personal information from you, for example, when you

- open an account or provide account information
- seek advice about your investments or tell us about your investment or retirement portfolio
- tell us about your investment or retirement earnings

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing? Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes — information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.

Definitions

Affiliates Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Our affiliates include the member companies of Corebridge such as American General Life Insurance Company.*

Nonaffiliates Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Corebridge does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

Joint Marketing A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *Corebridge does not jointly market.*

Other important information

Securities offered through VFA member FINRA, SIPC, and an SEC registered investment advisor. Annuities issued by VALIC and affiliates American General Life Insurance Company and The United States Life Insurance Company in the City of New York (USL; State of New York only). VALIC Company I investment options available in certain VALIC variable annuity contracts. Variable annuities underwritten and distributed by its affiliate, AIG Capital Services, Inc. (ACS), member FINRA. AIG Federal Savings Bank, providing retirement plan custodial and trustee services. HRA Administrator, LLC (HRAA), a VALIC company, provides health reimbursement arrangement administration support for employer groups. You have the right to see and, if necessary, correct personal data. This requires a written request, both to see your personal data and to request correction. For Vermont Residents only. We will not disclose information about your creditworthiness to our affiliates and will not disclose your personal information, financial information, credit report, or health information to nonaffiliated third parties to market to you, other than as permitted by Vermont law, unless you authorize us to make those disclosures. For California Residents only. We will not share information we collect about you with nonaffiliated third parties, except as permitted by California law, such as to process your transactions or to maintain your account.
